There are a number of vacancies in a range of practices. The appointments are permanent, 2 year contracts would be an option we would consider.

Benefits: Salaried GPs would attract 50 to 55 k per annum depending on experience, pro rata for part time candidates. The full time post attracts the Golden Hello of an additional 10 k pro rata for part time. 6 Weeks annual leave and 1 week study leave.

Candidates must possess their specialist certificate for their training in general practice which meets the requirements of the joint committee for General Practice Training UK or equivalent or proof of acquired right. Eligibility for Full Registration with the General Medical Council is essential.
