A good doctor patient relationship favourably influences patient health behaviour

The researchers concluded: "Patients' trust in their physician and commitment to the relationship offer a more complete understanding of the patient-physician relationship. In addition, trust and commitment favorably influence patients' health behaviors.

Statins reduce all-cause mortality in elderly patients

The researchers concluded: "Statins reduce all-cause mortality in elderly patients and the magnitude of this effect is substantially larger than had been previously estimated."

Viewing stressful football (soccer) matches associated with acute coronary events

The authors concluded: "Viewing a stressful soccer match more than doubles the risk of an acute cardiovascular event. In view of this excess risk, particularly in men with known coronary heart disease, preventive measures are urgently needed.

The researchers concluded: "In the present study, melanomas were generally apparent as UDs. The potential of the UD sign for melanoma screening should be further assessed."

No one DMARD or combination has been shown to be superior to others

The authors concluded: "Limited available comparative evidence does not support one monotherapy over another for adults with rheumatoid arthritis. Although combination therapy is more effective for patients whose monotherapy fails, the evidence is insufficient to draw firm conclusions about whether one combination or treatment strategy is better than another or

is the best treatment for early rheumatoid arthritis."
